Assistive Devices Program (ADP)	
 <u>Description</u> ADP can cover: prostheses; wheelchairs/mobility aids and specialized seating systems; enteral feeding supplies; monitors and test strips for insulin-dependent diabetics (through an agreement with the Canadian Diabetes Association); hearing aids; insulin pumps and supplies for children; respiratory equipment; orthoses (braces, garments and pumps); visual and communication aids; oxygen and oxygen delivery equipment, such as concentrators, cylinders, liquid systems and related supplies, such as masks and tubing 	 <u>Eligibility</u> Any Ontario resident who has a valid Ontario Health card issued in their name and has a physical disability of six months or longer Equipment cannot be required exclusively for sports, work or school. ADP does not pay for equipment available under the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board or to Group "A" veterans for their pensioned benefits There are specific eligibility criteria which apply to each device category Initial access is often through a medical specialist or general practitioner who provides a diagnosis In most device categories, an authorizer assesses the specific needs of the person and prescribes appropriate equipment or supplies

Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP)	
 Description ODSP offers two types of support: Income support - Financial assistance provided each month to help with the costs of basic needs, like food, clothing and shelter. Income support also includes benefits, like drug coverage and vision care, for clients and their eligible family members. Employment supports - Services and supports to help clients with disabilities find and keep a job, and advance their careers. 	 <u>Eligibility</u> Each type of support has its own eligibility requirements and application process. To qualify for ODSP income support, you must: be at least 18 years old be an Ontario resident be in financial need and meet the program's definition of a person with a disability, or be a member of a Prescribed Class A person does not have to be in receipt of ODSP Income Support to be eligible for ODSP Employment Supports. All applicants must provide documentation that he/she: has a disability/impairment that results in substantial barriers to employment

Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP)	
Description	<u>Eligibility</u>
 A registered disability savings plan (RDSP) is a savings plan that is intended to help parents and others save for the long term financial security of a person who is eligible for the disability tax credit (DTC). You can open an RDSP at a local bank. The banks that offer the RDSP can be found here: <u>http://www.esdc.gc.ca/eng/disability/sa</u> <u>vings/rdsp.shtml#financial</u> 	 You can designate an individual as beneficiary if the individual: is eligible for the disability tax credit (DTC); has a valid social insurance number (SIN); is a resident in Canada when the plan is entered into; and is under the age of 60 (a plan can be opened for an individual and contributions can be made to it until the end of the year in which he or she becomes 59 years of age).

- A medical practitioner has to complete and certify that the child has a severe and prolonged impairment and must describe its effects on Form T2201, Disability Tax Credit Certificate.
- Once the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) receives a completed Form T2201, the CRA will advise you if the child is eligible for the disability tax credit and the CDB supplement.

<u>Description</u>	<u>Eligibility</u>
 You can claim to a maximum of \$500 per child the fees paid in 2015 relating to the cost of registration or membership for your or your spouse's or common-law partner's child in a prescribed program of artistic, cultural, recreational, or developmental activity. An additional amount of \$500 is available if the child is eligible for the disability tax credit and a minimum of \$100 has been paid in eligible fees in the year. 	 The child must have been under 16 years of age (or under 18 years of age if eligible for the disability tax credit) at the beginning of the year in which an eligible arts expense was paid. You can claim this amount if another person has not already claimed the same fees and the total claimed is not more than the maximum amount that would be allowed if only one of you were making the claim. Children with disabilities - If the child is eligible for the disability tax credit and is under 18 years of age at the beginning of the year, you can claim an additional \$500 if a minimum of \$100 is paid for registration or membership fees for a prescribed artistic program.

Canada Mortgage and Housing Corpporation - Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program for Persons with Disabilities (RRAP-D) On-Reserve

Description

 RRAP-D On-Reserve offers financial assistance to First Nations and First Nation members to undertake accessibility work to modify dwellings occupied or intended for occupancy by persons with disabilities.

<u>Eligibility</u>

 First Nation members that require modifications to their homes may be eligible to apply. The total household income must be at or below the established income threshold for their area and the property must meet minimum health and safety standards.
